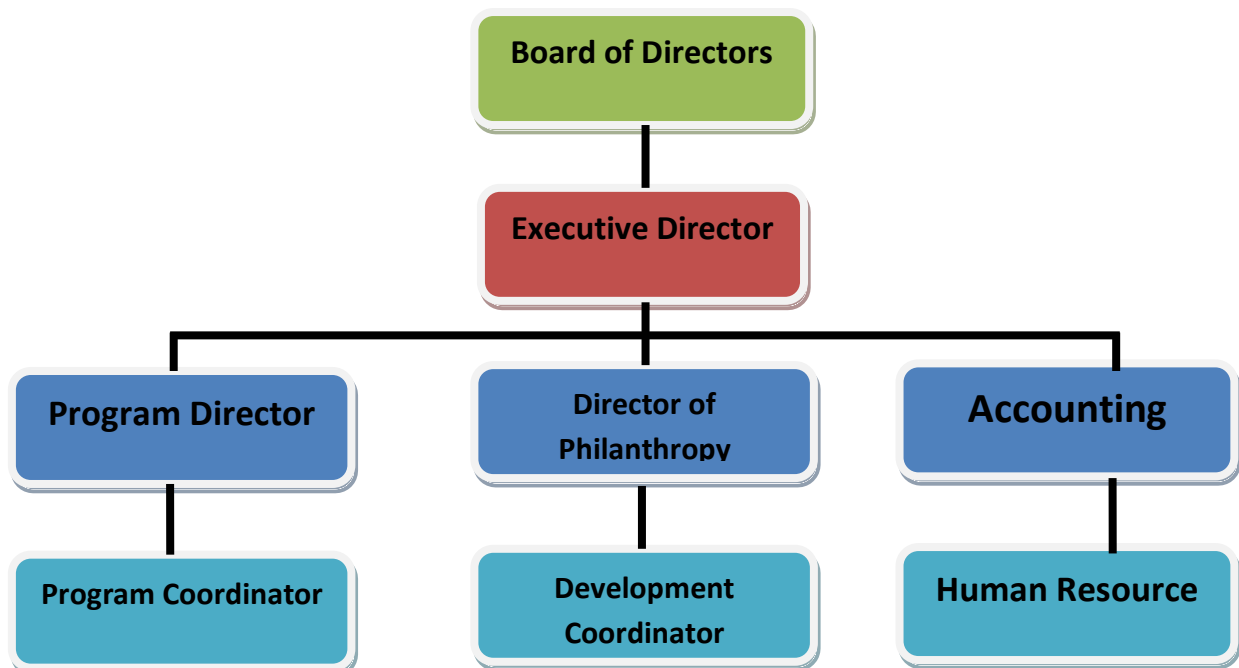

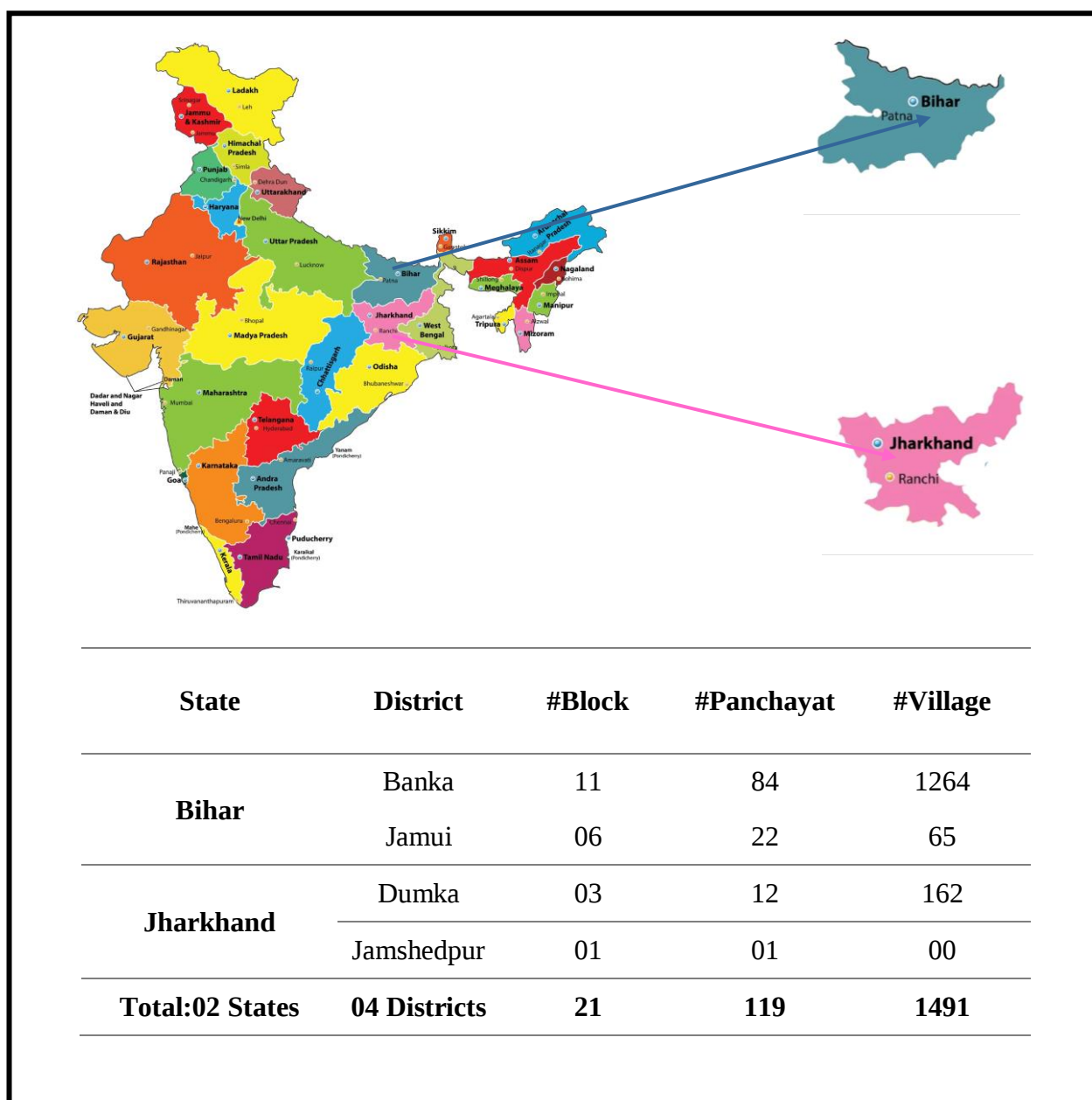

Programmes & Activities During the Year 2022-23

The programmes and activities carried on during the report year were in continuation of the previous years and also some sponsored and funded programmes were initiated which are described below:

Farmers Producer Organisation (FPO under NABARD scheme) Dumka



Agriculture is the only major means of livelihood of the targeted area of the districts for which the farmers have been following the traditional and conventional methodologies with conventional equipments, resources and technologies. Due to this, they are lagging behind and facing a lot of problems in their food security, livelihood and entitlement. Hence the GRAM NEHRU YUVA TRUST

took it as a mission to aware, educate and to impart trainings on various aspects for promotion of agriculture and ensuring entitlement. During the project period we have achieved many marvellous accomplishment...

Achievements/Result

- 2500 small and marginalized farmers linked with FPO for providing better opportunity of income generation, ensure livelihood.
- Organized 30 Gram Sabhas in 05 GPs of Dumka district. As result of it we have successfully formed of 05 FPO.
- Capacity build of 05 FPO members (500 members of each FPO) on new techniques of agriculture and horticulture, vegetable farming and poultry etc.
- Organized awareness generation program on farmers entitlement.
- We raised farmers' income by 45% during the project cycle by connecting them with FPO.



- Empowered 1000 women farmers, and the money earned after selling of the produce was directly transferred to the accounts of the women farmer of the family.

Income Generation Through Exhibition & Sale for Handicraft Product



The 10-day exhibition cum fair organized by Gram Nehru Yuva Trust at Tulsi Bhawan, Bishtupur auditorium in Jamshedpur (Jharkhand) with the support of Ministry of Textiles, Government of India. The exhibition aimed to elevate the income of rural handicraft artisans by facilitating direct sales of their products to customers. This initiative was a strategic effort to promote and sustain traditional crafts while bolstering the economic

prospects of artisans from rural areas. A total of 30 artisans were separately handling their stalls. The organization treats women equally. An example of this is that in this exhibition, 15 women were also given the opportunity to display the handicrafts and sale.

Achievements and Outcomes:

- **Income Augmentation:** By eliminating intermediaries, artisans could directly engage with customers, enhancing their profitability and economic stability.
- **Market Expansion:** The fair served as a bridge connecting rural artisans with a broader consumer base, including local residents, tourists, and businesses interested in authentic handicrafts.
- **Skill Enhancement:** Workshops and interactive sessions facilitated skill development among artisans, empowering them with new techniques and market insights.
- **Community Empowerment:** The participation of Gram Nehru Yuva Trust underscored the importance of community-driven initiatives in fostering sustainable development and preserving cultural heritage.



Relief program

Nutrition & Food Support

The relief program focused on nutrition and food support for pregnant women and malnourished children from 50 vulnerable families in Bokanama village, Katoria block, Banka district, Bihar. Facilitated by Rise Against Hunger, a humanitarian organization, the initiative aimed to address severe malnutrition and improve health outcomes in the community. The relief program effectively addressed nutritional deficiencies among pregnant women and malnourished children in Bokanama village, Banka district. It exemplified a holistic approach to humanitarian aid, emphasizing nutrition, health education, and community engagement to build resilience and promote long-term well-being.



Implementation Strategy:

1. **Target Beneficiaries:** The program identified 50 vulnerable families, prioritizing pregnant women and malnourished children who were at high risk due to food insecurity and poverty.
2. **Nutritional Support (Dry Rasan Kit):** Essential food items rich in proteins, vitamins, and minerals were distributed regularly to ensure balanced diets for pregnant women and children. This included fortified rice meals, nutritious snacks, and supplements tailored to meet their dietary needs.
3. **Health Monitoring:** Regular health check-ups and monitoring sessions were conducted to assess the nutritional status of beneficiaries, track progress, and provide necessary medical interventions.
4. **Community Engagement:** Local community leaders and health workers were involved in raising awareness about nutrition, hygiene practices, and the importance of maternal and child health care.



Impact and Outcomes:

- **Improved Nutrition:** Beneficiaries received sustained nutritional support, leading to improved health outcomes, especially among pregnant women and malnourished children.
- **Empowerment:** The program empowered vulnerable families by providing essential resources and knowledge to improve their dietary practices and overall well-being.
- **Sustainability:** Collaborative efforts with local stakeholders and ongoing support from Rise Against Hunger ensured the sustainability of the program's impact beyond its initial phase.

Child Protection Awareness Generation



In Jamui district, Bihar, a comprehensive effort was undertaken by Gram Nehru Yuva Trust to empower 80 local governance bodies (Mukhiya, Pradhan, Ward) known as Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) across 20 gram panchayats (GP) on child protection issues. The initiative focused specifically on ending child marriage and addressing violence against children through a series of orientation workshops. The primary objective of the workshops was to sensitize and empower PRIs

consisting of elected representatives and community leaders. The orientation/workshops were designed to empower PRIs about the detrimental effects of child marriage and various forms of violence against children. They were provided with comprehensive training on legal frameworks, child rights, and effective strategies to combat these issues at the grassroots level.

As a symbolic gesture of commitment, all PRIs participating in the workshops took an oath to actively work towards ending child marriage. This oath underscored their pledge to protect children from harmful practices and ensure their well-being.

Beyond awareness and advocacy, PRIs were encouraged to initiate the process of transforming their villages into child-friendly village. This involves creating safe spaces, promoting education, health care, and overall development conducive to children's growth and protection.
